"Share the Mission Award"



Fr. Kevin's Cluttered Desk

Today we celebrate. World Day of Prayer for Vocations. not vacations but rather vocations. But they have a lot in common. 1st they need a plan and then they need execution and then they need reflection. I have planned many a vacation in my life, but I have not been able to fulfill all those that I have planned. In some ways these plans are just dreams or ideas. This is similar to a vocation where we think we are called, we might be called, others think we are called but until we go we will never know. So we go and, like a vacation, it might be a great time, or it might be a disaster. Young men and young women go to the seminary or convent and they "discover" it might be the right fit or it might not be the right fit, but they need to go to find out. And again, like a vacation, if we have a bad vacation do we then refuse to ever go on another vacation? No, we don't give up on vacations. In the same way if we feel called to the priesthood or religious life, we might face some obstacles and struggles finding the right place or right fit. It is much harder for those called to religious life to find that fit, for if the spirituality does not align properly with the Order nothing will work. I have known young men and women who went to three or four different Orders before they found their fit, kind of like a vacation destination. We like the vacation, but does Mexico fit better than California, or Hawaii fit better than Australia, what is the best destination for you? As a Diocesan Priest we don't have the same problem since all of us are very different and mostly eclectic in our spirituality; we are a little of this and a little of that and a dash of something else. Probably the hardest challenge is "if you do feel the call" then don't give up on it.

As a good friend once put it, the struggle will help make a better priest out of you. If we cannot handle the struggle getting in and living the journey to religious life or the priesthood, how will we handle the struggles of religious life or the priesthood? For it is in the struggles that we learn to turn to God, to trust in God and give over to God. There is much freedom when we give over to God what is God's and focus on what is ours.
